This is a first Intermediate Cup Final for the men from North County Dublin who have conceded just once on their run to Sunday’s showdown.

The men from Balbriggan were handed a bye in Round One setting up an Dublin affair against St. Kevins FC. But Glebe North would put down an early marker beating St. Kevin’s 3-0 away from home.

In Round Two Glebe North run out 3-0 victors once again dispatching Greystone United in their first home game of the competition and in the next round it would be Maynooth University Town put to the sword by xxxxx’s team as they qualified out of the provincial section of the competition thanks to a 2-0 win.

Few draws could be tougher than an away trip to College Corinthians in Cork but Glebe North would make light work of their opponents recording their third 3-0 win of the competition.

It meant fellow Dublin team, Wayside Celtic, were the only team in their path stopping them from a first final and with the game 1-1 after 90 minutes an own goal would prove to be the winner for Glebe North to send them to the final in Drogheda.

Like their opponents, Ringmahon Rangers are playing in their first Intermediate Cup Final.

And they will be looking to keep the trophy in Co. Cork with Rockmount AFC winning the last two editions of the competition.

For the boys from Ringmahon their path to the final began with a 4-1 win away to fellow Cork side Fermoy FC and they would follow this up with a 2-1 victory of the competition’s most decorated side Avondale United.

It would be Cork versus Dublin in three consecutive rounds for Ringmahon Rangers with them overcoming Hartstown-Huntstown 1-0 in Round Three, Ayrfield United 3-2 in Round 4 and a 2-1 victory over Kibarrack United in the Quarter Finals.

That win in the last eight paved the way for a semi-final against the holders Rockmount

and with their fellow Cork side much fancied to proceed to a third-successive final, Ringmahon Rangers would earn an impressive 2-0 win that earned them a shot at history in the final on Sunday.

## Win over Maynooth gave us belief we'd lift the cup

Glebe North Manager Darius Kierans believes he has a team capable of bringing cup glory back to Balbriggan and that his time believe it too.

The North County Dublin team have had to navigate a tough run the final but netted 16 times and conceding just once en-route.

It was during this run that Kieran said he and team felt they could go all the way, he said: "We started against St. Kevin's and they're one of the best schoolboy clubs in the country with a young senior team so to beat them away was very pleasing.

"After them it was Greystones who have great quality then we played Maynooth University who are a very good side and play some of the best football you'll see at amateur level so that was always going to be tough. We were excellent on the night and it was probably at that point, I think, we started to believe there's an FAI Intermediate Cup or Leinster Senior League in this team, and it was from there the players started to believe."

After commanding wins in their first three games of the competition, Glebe came up against Cork opposition in College Corinthians in perhaps their most challenging game, Kierans added: "It's never easy to go down to Cork, it's a very good league down there. Rockmount the holders are down there and it looks like between College Corinthians and Ringmahon they've knocked Rockmount off their pedestal so it was always tough to go there and so to win convincingly was very pleasing."

It took until the semi-final for Glebe to concede their first goal in the competition and they went behind against Wayside Celtic. They equalised before an own goal late in extra time secured a first final for the Balbriggan club.

Describing what the win meant to the club, Kierans said: "It was a fantastic moment for the club. There are so many members who have put fantastic work into Glebe North FC over the last 79 years and they've never got to a national cup final.

"You're seeing grown men cry because it means so much for them. It means so much to everyone in Balbriggan, it's a small town but we've six or seven players from the town and others from all over the north east, it's brilliant for Glebe North - we're a club steeped in history."



## Noel Barrett: 'We can beat anyone on our day'

Glebe North captain Noel Barrett says his team believe they can beat anyone on their day as they prepare for an historic occasion in the FAI Intermediate Cup Final.

The North County Dublin club will make the short trip to Drogheda looking to land the club's first major trophy in its near 80 year history.

They overcame three-time winners of the competition Wayside Celtic to book a place in Sunday's final and skipper Barrett says his team have had to take a tough route to earn their shot at history.

He said: "We didn't have the easiest of routes to the final, we played Kevin's we beat College Corinthians away which was pleasing. That then set up Wayside in the semi-final, which we knew would be tricky because they are a very good side. We needed extra time but we got it done in the end."

Barrett did his best to describe the scenes as the club reached the final in such a manner, he added: "It was pandemonium. Fans were on the pitch, kids were on the pitch and just to be part of it was absolutely brilliant. Looking back to win it that way was extra special, it looked like we were heading into penalties but luckily we got the job done."

With just one goal conceded in their journey to the final, Barrett says his team have reason to be confident, he added: "We always believe we can beat anyone on our day. We don't look too far ahead, it's one game at a time and we're just delighted to be here in the final.

"It's massive (to be in the final), the club is 70 odd years old, and we've never made the final, we've probably underachieved not making it before, but look, we want to give a good account of ourselves and hopefully on the day it's the right result."



## Foley hoping Ringmahon's history-making run ends in glory

Regardless of the outcome on Sunday, Ringmahon Rangers Manager Aidan Foley has already made history by leading his side to a first FAI Intermediate Cup Final.

But for Foley, who has knocked out two of the competition's big hitters in Avondale United and Rockmount AFC, a chance at bringing home the cup would put his team among those great Cork clubs.

He said: "Looking back on this run to the final brings back a lot of great memories

because it has been a hard run and to get through that - we're pretty chuffed.

"To win the semi-final was huge, Rockmount have been the team for the last few years so to beat them in the semi-final was massive for us - beating them was a great achievement in itself."

Ringmahon has been buzzing with excitement in the lead up to the game and Foley knows his club stand one win away from reaching heights it has never reached before.

"I don't think people realise how big this would be for the club," said Foley.

"Not only have we never won at intermediate level we've never won at national level for a club our size, it's something our club strives to do, so touch wood we'd be the team to go and do it.

"Yesterday I was walking to the car and I'm seeing bunting around the place, all the academy group chats are encouraging people to dress up their homes in red and black, we've buses coming up, people travelling by train - this is huge for the community. You walk down the street and people are wishing us the best of luck.

"It's very special to us."



## Cup rivalry win injects belief into Ringmahon

Ringmahon Rangers captain Anthony McAlavey says beating Cork rivals Rockmount AFC gave his team the belief they could go all the way in this Sunday's FAI Intermediate Cup Final.

Rockmount have won the competition five times and were the current holders until Ringmahon beat them 2-0 in the semi-final to reach a first ever Intermediate Cup Final.

McAlavey says it was an 'eye-opening moment' that made the team believe their run could end in cup glory.

He said: "It's the first time in the club's history that we've got to the final but we feel like we've been knocking on the door for the last few years, we've had three semi-finals in the last five years, so it's good to get over the line and reach a final.

"To get over the line versus Rockmount was huge because it was an eye-opening moment where it felt like we are the real deal now and hopefully we can go on and win it. What they (Rockmount) have done over the last two seasons has been unbelievable, they've won the league in Cork and the Intermediate Cup back-to-back, so to beat them on the day we felt like we deserved to be here (in the final).

"You know the lads from Rockmount, you know the lads from Avondale and College Corinthians, you see them around Cork and they have the bragging rights, and rightfully so, so hopefully it's our moment now."

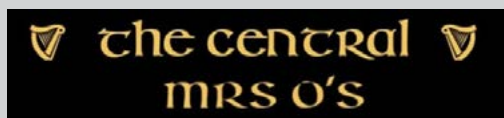
Ringmahon are set to be backed by a sizeable following at Weavers Park on Sunday and the skipper says lifting the cup would repay the volunteers and community who have faith in them.

He added: "This is huge for the club, huge. It's all the volunteers who put the hard hours in and it's such a big thing for the community.

"Everyone in the community is buying into it so it's a huge day for the club and hopefully we can win the cup and repay them."

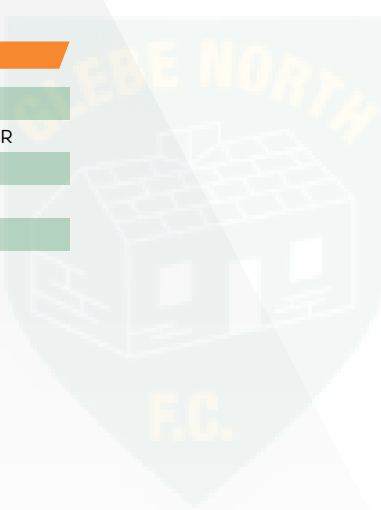
